- What has the suffering of Jesus accomplished for all mankind? What has the suffering of Jesus accomplished specifically for you?
- How do you feel when you are suffering unjustly?
- What do you think about God while you are suffering unjustly?
 Do you doubt God? Do you doubt His goodness?

 What would change in your life if you were willing to give up your way for someone else's sake?
